Ken Jue

Ken was a powerful force for good, guided by a deep commitment to community, collaboration, and inclusion throughout his life. He lived his values; bringing people together, strategizing for positive change, rolling up his sleeves, and addressing inequities when necessary. Countless organizations and individuals are stronger from Ken's involvement and caring nature, including MUW.

When Ken rotated off the Board in 2021 after 40 years of volunteering in every role possible, MUW presented him with the inaugural Ken Jue Award. Granted to someone who exemplifies qualities embodied by Ken, board member Barbara Tremblay received the 2022 Award for a lifetime dedicated to education, children, and families. (pages 4–5)

Thank you, Ken, for the legacy you have created and the guideposts you've given us all to follow, and to people like Barbara, who embody the characteristics that make our community strong and vibrant.

Funded Partners

In renewing our strategic commitment to collective impact, we proudly announced our second round of multi-year funding, awarding more than \$2 million over three years which eliminates the annual cycle of ask, report, ask again - allowing partners to use their valuable time achieving their goals.

This Collective Impact approach has yielded some impressive results. For example:

- Over 70% of visitors accessed more fresh produce at eight local food pantries from Rindge to Chesterfield and towns between.
- Over 1,900 families received education and programming through the Monadnock Alliance for Families, up from 989 in 2020.

We extend our gratitude to all our donors, volunteers, supporters, board, and staff for their commitment to MUW's vision of "A United community where all are cared for and thriving." Together, we can continue to make a positive impact in our community and beyond.

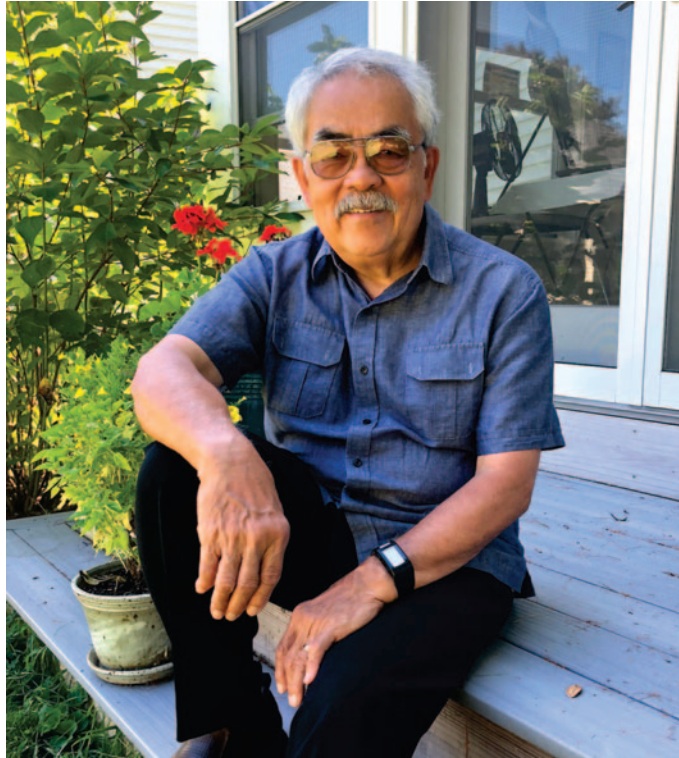

The Ken Jue Award

Monadnock United Way's Ken Jue Award was established in 2021 to honor Ken, a tireless MUW volunteer, two-term Board Chair, and dedicated community advocate, who sadly passed away in May 2022. The award is presented to an individual, business, nonprofit, or community-based initiative at the annual campaign Kickoff in September. A committee of volunteers selects the honoree based on three key criteria that exemplify qualities embodied by Ken:

- **Championing initiatives that impact the lives of individuals and our community as a whole**
- **Promoting and engaging in deep collaboration to strengthen outcomes**
- **Ensuring that people have the opportunity to participate in solutions affecting their lives**

Who Was Ken Jue?

Ken's service to the community is legendary. He worked at Monadnock Family Services for 33 years, retiring as CEO in 2011. Ken was widely recognized as a leader in mental health care at a local, state, national, and international level, consulting in Europe, South America, Asia, and the Pacific. He was awarded an honorary doctoral degree from Keene State College in 2007, one of his proudest achievements. Ken was chosen Keene's Citizen of the Year in 2000 and carried the Olympic flame down Main Street in 1996. The Ken Jue Award will act as an inspiration and recognition to generations of volunteers and leaders.

Award Recipients

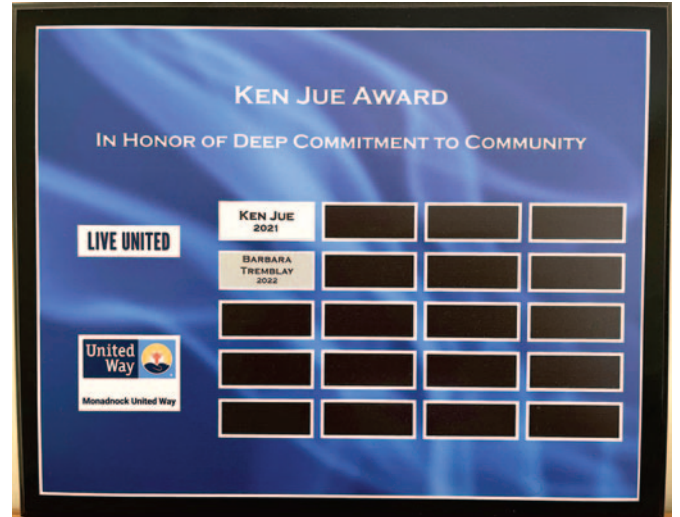
Fittingly, the recipient of the 1st Annual Ken Jue Award was – Ken Jue. In her remarks, MUW President Liz LaRose cited Ken's role on the Board and his leadership during a period of great change at MUW. Liz commented, "Your commitment to serving others compels us all to identify solutions that profoundly affect people's lives."

Ken's response was typical of his humility and championing of others. He said, "Many people have done what I have done for our communities, and many are doing incredible community volunteer service now. So, it is a special honor for me to be recognized in this manner when so many others also deserve such recognition. I have completely enjoyed the people who have volunteered alongside me, and I have long believed that the Monadnock United Way is an excellent vehicle for doing this volunteer work."

Barbara Tremblay received the 2nd Annual Ken Jue Award in recognition of a lifetime dedicated to the community. She enjoyed a 40+ year career in public and higher education, in a wide range of roles. Barbara also served on numerous non-profit boards and professional organizations in the Keene area and statewide, including MUW, Impact Monadnock (now part of MUW), Cheshire Medical Center, Cedarcrest, the Keene Endowment Association at Keene State College, Rise for baby and family, and the Ladies' Charitable Society.

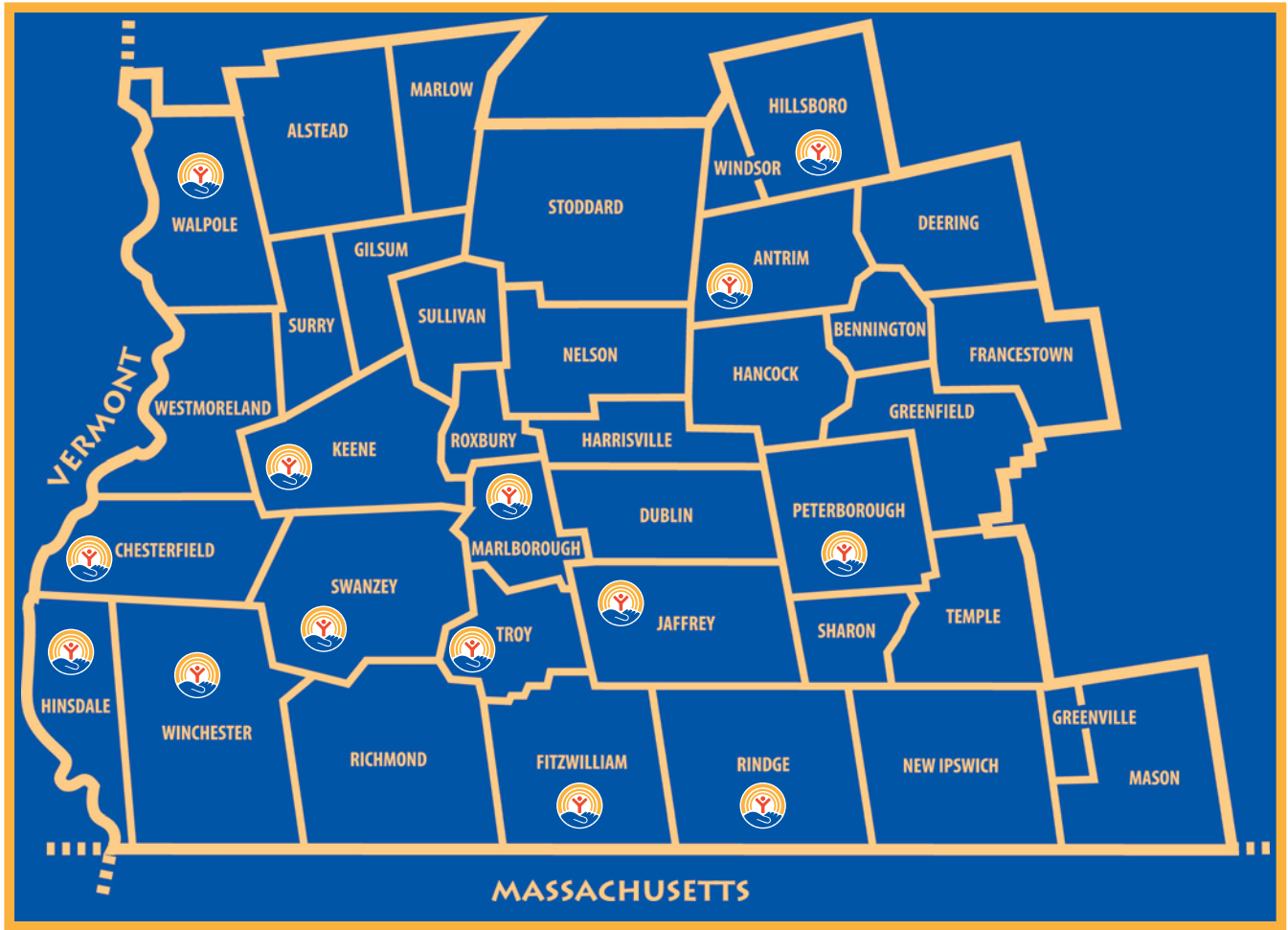
