Every day, the Monadnock Alliance for Families works to realize its vision that all families in the Monadnock Region have access to high-quality services that strengthen parenting and promote optimal child development. To meet that vision, the agencies are collaborating to:

- Increase the number of families accessing services in the region through a shared outreach coordinator
- Improve the quality of the services through shared professional development goals for home visitors
- Prevent child abuse and neglect by implementing the <u>Strengthening Families Protective Factors</u> into all aspects of their work

The Monadnock Alliance for Families (MAF) is a collaborative backed by Impact Monadnock. The Alliance is composed of Healthy Starts at Home Healthcare Hospice & Community Services (HCS), The Grapevine Family and Community Resource Center, Monadnock Family Services (MFS), Rise for Baby and Family, and The River Center Family and Community Resource Center.

Regional Impact

An objective of the <u>MAF</u> is to ensure young children (0-8 years) are safe, healthy, and resilient. To meet this objective, the MAF identified strategies that are reported on twice a year. In 2023, the following impact was made:

Strategy: Connect at-risk youth and families to high-quality, appropriate, coordinated supports and services

- 857 families served
- 474 (55%) are new home visiting clients

Strategy: Address basic needs that support children's success

- 1,996 clients participated in parent education and enriched engagement services
- 1,697 (85%) reported an increase in at least 3 protective factors*

Strategy: Improve community climate for children and families

• 30 staff members (100%) are thoroughly trained in embedding the protective factors into their work

Work In-Action

In 2020, the joy of first-time parenthood was marred by tragedy for Amber and her husband when one of their twin sons was stillborn and the other needed to stay in the hospital for two months. Amber describes it as a scary time with COVID-19 since their son was vulnerable and could not get sick. "Not being able to go out and see people made it really hard, especially since we were grieving the loss of our other son," said Amber.

After a year, Amber felt it was safe to venture out with her son to connect with others. Despite seeking solace in grief groups and spaces for sharing her loss, Amber often found that other group members were indifferent. Fortunately, another parent introduced her to the Better Beginnings program at the email address

Grapevine. "The Grapevine has become my village,"
Amber remarked gratefully. "Here, I have a haven where I can entrust my child to caring adults while I connect with fellow parents." Amber reflects on this as the first time she and her son separated. She found support and a nonjudgmental atmosphere in her Grapevine parent group. "I also appreciate what a difference it makes having a group facilitator like Carol. She helps build conversation and facilitates an environment for sharing."

What would Amber say to other parents and caregivers looking for a connection for themselves and their children?
"Parenting communities can be full of labels and sometimes feel divisive," Amber concluded, "But the Grapevine is a place that feels safe and full of acceptance."
