Funding is intended to support, at a regional level, the development of a statewide system of partnerships that enhance early childhood care and education (ECCE)-school-family support collaborations and build coalition infrastructure for cross-sector collaboration within the region.

Strengths and Needs Assessment


Early Childhood Region 1 is conducting a strengths and needs assessment to gain a better understanding of:

- Families' experience raising their children in the region
- Where resources and services exist within our region and who uses them that would benefit from funding
- Assets, gaps, and barriers in early childhood services that need additional attention

Our guiding questions are:

- 1. What is working well that needs more funding/continued funding?
- 2. What are the gaps that need new funding?
- 3. What are the opportunities for collaboration with other agencies/organizations?

Introducing Collaboration Through Mentoring

The Coaching Through Collaboration project has been successful in elevating professional development within the region through Practice-Based Coaching. It is evident, however, that there could be additional opportunities to share the wealth of knowledge and skills across the region on a smaller scale.

The Collaboration Through Mentorship (CTM) initiative aims to support short-term collaborative partnerships between individuals or organizations in various sectors of early childhood across the region.

Potential mentors can offer to share their knowledge and skills by applying to work

- with others.
- Those seeking skill or knowledge development can apply as a mentee in search of a mentor.
- Individuals or organizations can apply together as matched mentors/mentees.

The intent of the rolling application process is to be flexible and quickly meet the individual needs of the applicants. CTM will maximize impact through matching mentors and mentees for short-term collaboration.

EC Region 1 Project Collaboration Through Coaching


The ECR1 Collaboration Through Coaching project was approved for funding in December 2021. By the beginning of March 2022, 9 coaches were trained in the Practice Based Coaching model and completed the Strengthening Families online training modules. Each area of the region (Upper Valley, Greater Sullivan County and the Monadnock Region) has at least one trained coach in this cohort. Early Childcare and Education, Schools, Family Supports and Higher Education are all represented.

The coaches are beginning to use their new coaching skills to each coach two others in the field with a focus on a variety of promising practices (Trauma Informed Care, Pyramid Model for Social Emotional Competence in Young Children, Inquiry-based Learning, Nature-based Education, Play-based Learning, Child Development Associate Credential).

The coach coordinators will continue to support the cohort with Professional Learning Community sessions, individual coach meetings and sharing of resources. We look forward to sharing their progress with others in the region!

Field Notes: Family Resource Centers

Family Resource Centers are community-based programs that provide a variety of services to children



and families, including parent education, information and referrals, grandparent support groups, mentoring, educational support, cultural and arts events, and other services.


In addition to parenting education, in-home support for families, and activities for children and caregivers, The

River Center Family and Community Resource Center also provides free tax preparation and assist eligible families to apply for the Child Tax Credit.

Family resource centers throughout New Hampshire have access to funding to support families with 0-12 years old in the household. This is provided by a generous donation given through the NH Charitable Foundation. This additional funding has enabled The River Center to support families through assistance with car repairs, dental bills, bicycle repairs, wood pellets, plumbing and more.
