LEADERSHIP CORNER

Dear Friends of MUW,

2018 was both exhilarating and challenging. We implemented the second year of our strategic plan (which is designed to harness the power of collective impact) to address the most pressing needs for children, education, and financial stability in every community in the Monadnock region.

When we initiated the strategic shift in our funding cycle last year, our board and staff decided to roll it out over a 3-4 year period to give our partners and the community time to fully understand, plan, and adjust to the changes. To that end, all programs received flat funding in 2018. The new plan is resonating with our partners, donors, and communities as we all start to see the benefits of collective impact.

As part of an ongoing effort to strengthen and diversify our funding sources, we successfully applied for grants related to

our focus areas. We are happy to report that we received \$126,000 in additional funding, over and above campaign gifts, to benefit our partners and communities.

One such grant is a generous \$50,000 from New Hampshire Charitable Foundation. With those funds, the Monadnock Home Visiting Alliance (our pilot collective) hired a shared outreach coordinator. This individual reaches out to referral sources and families across the region, and funnels referrals to the four programs in this collective. This new position eliminated the need for each of the four programs to hire their own coordinators. The shared outreach coordinator successfully increased the number of referrals and families served, a win-win situation for the members of this collective and the community.

Impact Monadnock attracted the NH Department of Education's Pyramid Model initiative to the region. This model is a proven system that supports teachers, caregivers, and families help young children develop healthy social and emotional skills that will serve them throughout their lives. The initiative provides Pyramid Coaches for professionals in child-care centers throughout the Monadnock region for the next four years.

Transitioning to a new funding model is a major undertaking and impacts all of Monadnock United Way's partners. In the end, emphasizing collective impact and pooling resources makes sense for everyone. We look forward to building on the momentum realized in 2018 to continue this important work.


