The Castle Center for Life Enrichment, a service of Home Healthcare Hospice & Community Services, has reopened its doors! The Castle Center is a licensed, medical adult day program offering a little help during the day for folks with medical needs or who need memory care, providing an opportunity for respite for family caregivers. Socializing, music, art, gardening, crafts, exercise, and time for peace and quiet are just some of the wide variety of activities available at the Castle Center. Healthy meals and snacks are provided

each day. Our fully vaccinated team of nurses, licensed nurse assistants and volunteers are on hand to assist with medication monitoring and personal care. Participants are welcome from throughout the area; participants must be fully vaccinated to enroll.

In 2017 <u>The Community Kitchen</u> (TCK) received a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for some much needed upgrades and renovations to their Mechanic Street building. Those monies enabled TCK to completely renovate their kitchen, install two new walk-in freezers and a walk-in cooler, install a new conveyor belt, and make the second floor of the building structurally secure.

Those improvements were amazing and went a long way to ensuring the building could withstand another 20 years of service for the organization; the utility bills, however, were still coming in at \$3,500 plus per month for electricity. The City of Keene has an ambitious renewable energy plan. When TCK approached the City of Keene to support another CDBG application for a solar array the city was on board and enthusiastic. TCK is also using this opportunity to overhaul the HVAC in the building, giving the staff more zones, more control, and (hopefully) more savings.

The project was delayed by pandemic-related issues, but with much excitement the work started in July. One of the contractors had said this project would be even more intrusive and disruptive than the last and, two months in, everyone at the Kitchen would agree! The Hot Meals Program was displaced completely, but the Salvation Army agreed to partner for the 6-8 weeks the evening dinner and Sunday lunch couldn't be served at Mechanic Street. This has been a great collaboration and The Community Kitchen is indebted to the Salvation Army Keene Corps. Lieutenants David and Emma LaBossiere could not have been more welcoming or helpful.

Both the Pantry Program and Hot Meals Program will continue to be served as the Kitchen's version of "drive-through" until at least early into 2022. This might be seen as an overabundance of caution but we are committed to keeping our guests, clients, volunteers and staff as safe as possible. The board and staff of the Kitchen are continuously appraising the situation but feel that staying "remote" is the best for now.



## **Lots Happening at The Keene Senior Center!**

- The Senior Center reopened on August 2nd after being closed since March of 2020. Members
  are coming in for classes such as yoga and Age in Motion, quilters are meeting to work on
  projects, and an active card making group is creating amazing designs. These and other

- The Senior Center took advantage of the shutdown to renovate the interior. By adding a new hallway, we were able to improve the flow of traffic and improve overall space use. An external ramp has been delayed until the Spring due to high material costs and busy contractors. In the meantime, we've heard plenty of compliments about the new design, and lovely comments about the openness and feeling of space in the rooms. The Senior Center is safer, more functional, and very attractive.
- We've also had help from community partners. Volunteers from <u>Honda of Keene</u> helped manage the Japanese knotweed infestation. We moved over nine yards of mulch, and that was after cutting down the knotweed and covering the area with plastic! Lots of thanks to the <u>Fenton Family Dealership</u> for encouraging their employees to volunteer in the community!
- A large group of <u>Upward Bound</u> students help reorganize the Bargain Box Thrift Store which
  reopened in June. They also dug out the front gardens in preparation for a new look. It was a
  hot day and a massive undertaking, but they were a smiling and helpful group. We couldn't
  have done it without them.
- We recently received a grant from the <u>Monadnock United Way</u> to do a needs assessment on digital literacy and access for seniors in the Monadnock Region. This is a collaborative effort with the Monadnock Social Services Collective. The SWRPC will be conducting the assessment.
- We just completed our successful first <u>Golf Tournament</u> fundraiser! Next up is the <u>DeMar Marathon</u> and the <u>Walk for Alzheimer's</u>. We are the November Hannaford Book Sale recipients and our Holiday Faire is in December, with awesome gift baskets, quilts, cookies and greens for sales. There is always something fun going on at the Senior Center come join us!



#### **Monadnock Alliance for Families Strives to Provide Family Supports Through Covid-19**

Thanks to Monadnock United Way, the <u>Monadnock Alliance for Families</u> (MAF) will be able to provide more help to local families in the coming months as they navigate ongoing COVID-related financial and emotional challenges.

Together, the five Alliance organizations provide support for both parents and children through home visits, resource assistance, educational programs, and specialized services for children with confirmed or suspected developmental delays and disabilities. For many families who were already struggling, whether emotionally, financially, or in terms of their child's development, the impacts of COVID have been huge.

Those impacts continue as COVID continues to impact all our lives. Rising rents and limited housing availability, together with rising prices for all kinds of things, are stretching budgets to the max. Rapidly changing work and school situations are causing plenty of anxiety. As a result, many families need help now as much as earlier in the pandemic.

Thanks to a special \$15,000 COVID recovery grant from MUW, the Alliance organizations will be able to provide additional support to families: help connecting with available local resources (including food, fuel, and housing assistance programs) and direct support in emergency situations. That means more help for families trying to understand what local programs they qualify for and the steps to completing an application. It also means gift cards for gas and food for families with immediate and urgent needs.

For example, The River Center was recently able to help a struggling mom who was reuniting with her young children, currently living away from her, for a birthday visit. Thanks to gift cards the organization had set aside, this mom was able to take her children out for a special family dinner. This

gift meant so much!

## **City Express Updates Schedule**

The City Express, a service of Home Healthcare, Hospice and Community Services (HCS) and Keene's bus for everyone, is now running two buses throughout the City on an updated schedule. The two bus routes are operating Monday through Friday and are open to the public; no reservations are required.

Route changes made over the summer in response to changing rider needs due to the pandemic include more frequent service to grocery stores, including Market Basket, Riverside and West Street Plazas, and Monadnock Marketplace.



Bus service runs from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm, with service at many stops, particularly residential areas downtown, receiving service every thirty minutes.

The team has 1950 applications in process so far and will continue taking applications through April 2022.

#### **Summer Foods Program**

SCS is happy to report that 26,396 meals were served for the Summer Foods Program! This total comes from both breakfasts and lunches served to area children and included curbside pick-up at Keene Middle School as well as distribution to area camps, including City of Keene Parks and Rec, Keene Family YMCA, Swanzey Day Camp, and the Keene Public Library.
